



# Turks & Caicos Islands Entry Requirements

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## Our Commitment to Your Safety

We are proud to announce that all team members at Wymara have been fully vaccinated and are required to wear masks at all times. Turks & Caicos remains one of the safest islands in the Caribbean with a 76% vaccination rate and stringent COVID travel requirements.

## Vaccine and Testing Requirements

All visitors 18 and older will be required to present proof of vaccination. Travelers must be fully vaccinated, with the second shot taken over two weeks prior to traveling, or one shot taken over two weeks prior for the Johnson & Johnson vaccine.

### What vaccines are accepted:

Johnson & Johnson, Pfizer, Moderna, AstraZeneca, Comirnaty, Spikevax, Vaxzevria, Covishield, Novavax, COVOVAX, Covaxin, Sinopharm Ver Cells and Sinovac CoronaVac.

### Who is exempt:

Visitors under the age of 18 are no longer required to present vaccination status or negative tests upon entry.

Visitors who are not able to take a COVID-19 vaccine due to medical reasons. However, written and signed proof from a medical professional clearly stating that they are medically exempted from taking the vaccine must be submitted to the Ministry of Health at [vaccineexemptions@gov.tc](mailto:vaccineexemptions@gov.tc). Persons seeking a medical exemption should send a request with all supporting documentation at least 2 weeks prior to travel. Individuals must present evidence of the approval of the medical exemption from the Ministry of Health.

### Is testing still required?

No. Testing is no longer required for fully vaccinated travelers entering Turks & Caicos.

### Accepted Proof of Vaccination for non-exempt travelers:

Proof of vaccination is either a digital or paper record which must be presented on arrival. Acceptable forms are:

- E-certificate/digital certificate (such as those from CVS, Walgreens, or the NHS).
- Certification issued by a doctor or government entity.
- Vaccination cards/certificates accepted by national authorities.
- A letter signed by a medical professional on official letterhead with contact details. Doctor's registration or license number should be included with details of the first and second dose (date, country and vaccine you received).
- Authorized government entity record or printed record from an electronic vaccination database.
